These countries have previously sent troops into the DRC to hunt down rebel groups based there. The Diocese of Bujumbura said after the recent massacre: <i>As a church, we are calling upon the apostles of peace as friends and partners to continue praying with us. Please give support in this peace process so that this culture of violence that is sweeping our region in general, and our country in particular, might stop, and peace be restored.</i>
